

**CODE OF CONDUCT
ALL KART DRIVERS & PIT CREW**



BEHAVIOUR AT RACE MEETINGS:

- Participate in accordance and within the rules and participate for your own enjoyment and benefit.
- Competitors are responsible for their own conduct as well as the conduct of any persons associated with them, such as pit crew, kart owners and sponsors.
- Never argue with an official. Most stewards have volunteered their services for the smooth, efficient and fair conduct of these race meetings. If you have a complaint there are appropriate procedures in place.
- Control your temper. Verbal abuse of officials and sledging other drivers, deliberately distracting or provoking an opponent are not acceptable or permitted behaviours.
- Treat all participants in your sport, as you like to be treated. Do not bully or take unfair advantage of another competitor.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion

PREPARING TO RACE OR PRACTICE:

- The Executive Committee must approve in writing the use of the track facilities and equipment for any practice or race meeting.
- Driver is responsible for kart owner and crew at all times at race meeting. Driver must ensure that all pit crew are wearing an armband and appropriate clothing and footwear.
- No smoking in pit area or track arena unless in designated smoking area.
- No consumption of Alcohol in the pit area.

SCRUTINEERING:

- Kart scrutineering will be conducted in the area nominated by the club.

WORKING ON KARTS:

- Driver and crew working on go karts are to do so in a safe manner and using safe methods at all times and in the designated pit area.

RACE TIME:

- Bring kart to dummy grid when called at a safe pace.
- Driver to be ready to race with helmets and other safety equipment when called.

AFTER RACE HAS FINISHED:

- Driver to leave the racetrack at a safe speed.
- Any disputes or protests must be managed in accordance with the club judicial procedures.

SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY:
